One of the outstanding linemen in Canadian football, Kaye three times has been a double All-Star, making both offensive and defensive teams in 1956, 1957 and 1959. He was also All-Star offensive guard in 1953, his first year with Ottawa and in 1960. Voted Canada's outstanding lineman in 1956 and 1957. Married to world champion skier, Lucile Wheeler.

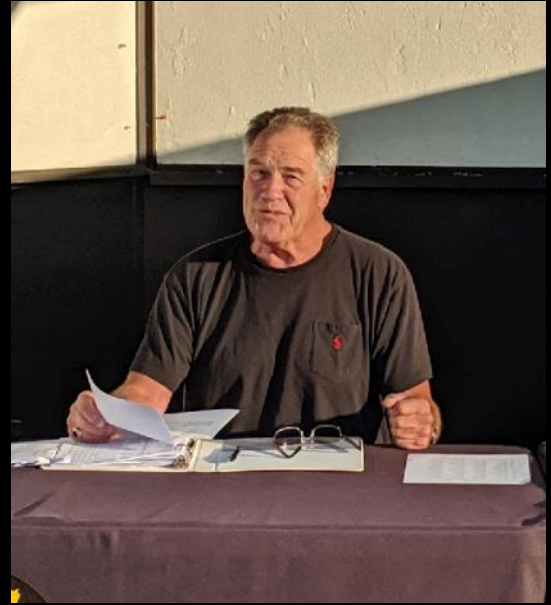

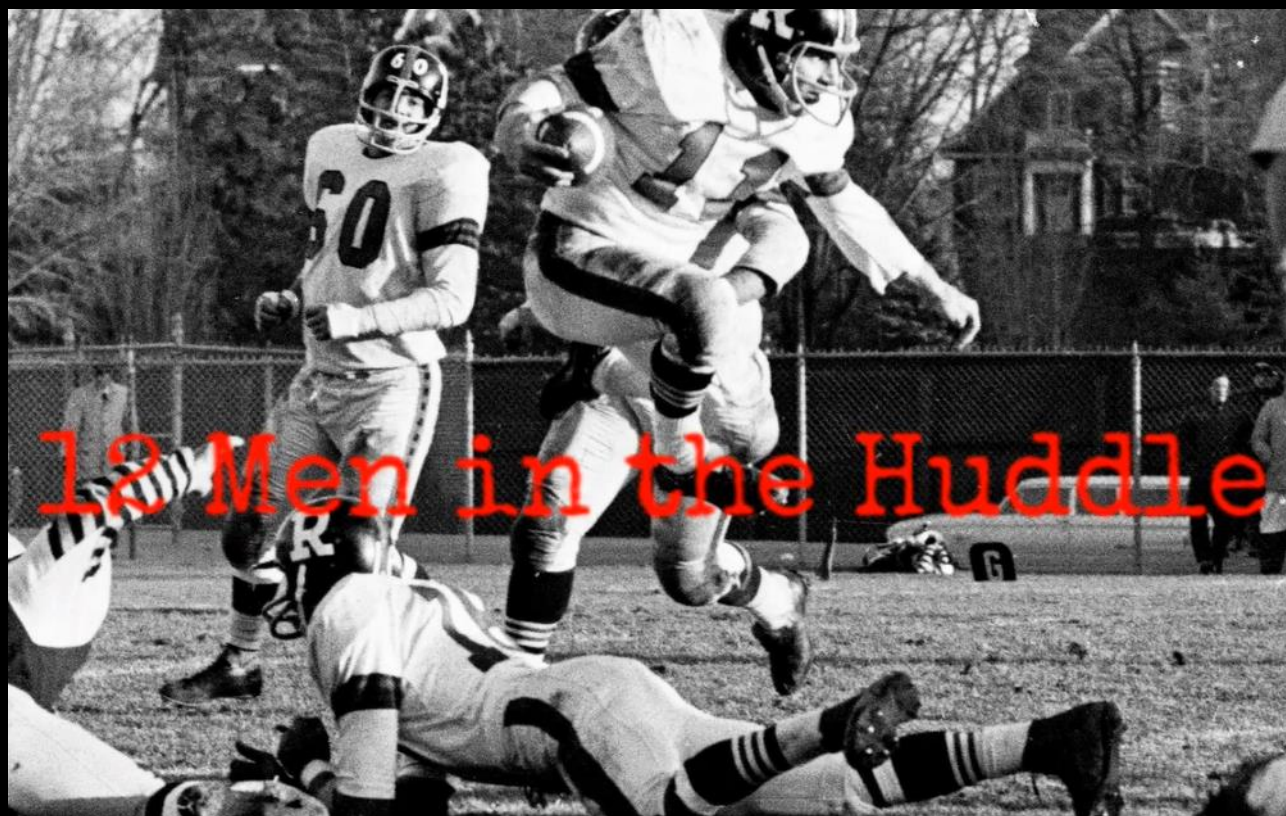

# CARLETON RAVENS PODCAST WITH JEFF MORRIS

When former Carleton Raven and 2018 Metras Trophy winner Kene Onyeka of the Ottawa Redblacks played in Edmonton recently, he got the chance to play against his former Ravens teammate, offensive lineman Kwabena Asare, who was playing in his first CFL game.

But even more exciting was that Onyeka got to play against his brother, Eskimos DB Godfrey Onyeka. While a number of brothers have been teammates on an Ottawa CFL team, very few Ottawa players have gone against their brother in a CFL game.

On July 27, 1977, Tony and Peter Gabriel faced each other in front of 45,450 fans at Exhibition Stadium. The Argos won 17-1, and Peter actually had more receptions than his Grey Cup hero big brother. Peter Gabriel played three years in the CFL and lived in the shadows of his big brother, never living up to his name. Ironically, he was also a talented musician who never lived up to the name of Peter Gabriel from Genesis. Gabriel often refers to Tony and himself as the Wayne and Keith Gretzky of the CFL.

In the late 60s, the Collins brothers faced each other. Ted "Lunch" Collins played for three teams, including Ottawa, and played both with and against his brother, Doug "Brunch" Collins. As you might have figured out by their nicknames, both were offensive linemen.

Perhaps the most unique story of brothers playing against each other in the CFL involves the Dunlap brothers, who played football at St. Pat's College in the 1940s, a generation before St. Pat's became part of Carleton University.

Jake Dunlap was a "middle", which was what offensive tackles were called at that time. After leaving St. Pat's, Dunlap played for the Ottawa Trojans of the ORFU in 1944 before moving up to the Rough Riders in the IRFU the following year. Dunlap played for four years with the Riders before moving to Toronto to study law at Osgood Hall. While there, he played for the Argos and won the 1950 Grey Cup. Known in Grey Cup history as the "Mud Bowl", Toronto defeated Winnipeg 13-0, and Dunlap's blocked punt led to the game's only touchdown.

Jake Dunlap was also the first player in Canadian football to wear a facemask on his helmet because he had broken his nose so many times.

He returned to Ottawa and won a Grey Cup with the Rough Riders in 1951. He played for Hamilton in 1952 but returned to Ottawa and earned CFL All Star honours in 1953. Dunlap is also well known for being the General Manager of the Ottawa Rough Riders from 1978-82.

An even more interesting figure in St. Pat's football history is Jake's older brother, Frank Dunlap. At St. Pat's, Frank starred in football, hockey and debating. He had an opportunity to go to Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana on a full football scholarship, but the scholarship was cancelled after the attack on Pearl Harbour, which led to the United States entering the war.

Frank left St. Pat's to go to St. Michael's College in Toronto, where he played hockey for the St. Mike's Majors. From there, he went on to play for the Toronto Maple Leafs. His contract was to play only in home games, as he was enrolled in law school full time.





Hall, he left for Toronto and joined the Argos. He came back to Ottawa in 1950, and in 1951, he and his brother were teammates on Ottawa's 1951 Grey Cup championship team.

Frank and Jake would go on to practice law in their firm, Dunlap and Dunlap. He eventually ran for the Liberal Party in Ottawa-Carleton in 1957 but lost to Dick Bell. In 1967, he was appointed as a Judge, where he remained until his sudden passing in 1993.

## TRIVIA

And here is a great Rough Riders trivia question for you.

There are only two CFL quarterbacks who have ever gone on to have their numbers retired by NFL teams. The obvious one is Warren Moon, whose number 1 is retired by the Tennessee Titans, previously the Houston Oilers. The other CFL QB whose number is retired by an NFL team played for both Ottawa and Saskatchewan in the CFL. Can you name him?

The hint: He is also the only Ottawa Rough Rider to have a son go on to play in the NBA.

The answer is Frank Tripucka.

Tripucka led Notre Dame to a 9-0-1 record and a number two ranking in 1949, setting a Fighting Irish record by throwing 11 TD passes in one season. Tripucka was selected ninth overall by the Philadelphia Eagles, who immediately traded him to the Detroit Lions. He played for the Lions, the Chicago Cardinals and Dallas Texans before heading north to play for the Saskatchewan Roughriders. He played with the Green Riders from 1953 to 1958, before being traded to Ottawa in 1959.

In 1960, Saskatchewan coach Frank Filchock was hired by the Denver Broncos of the newly formed AFL, and he brought Tripucka to Denver with him to be an assistant coach. Because the quarterbacks performed so poorly in training camp, Filchock activated Tripucka and he became the Broncos' first starting quarterback. That year, he became the first quarterback in American pro football history to pass for 3,000 yards in a season.

The Broncos retired Tripucka's number 18. When Peyton Manning signed with the Broncos, he did not want to wear 18 out of respect for Tripucka. However, Tripucka insisted Manning wear the number. Manning asked how he could repay Tripucka for allowing him to wear his number, and Tripucka said, "Go out and win a Super Bowl for me."

Manning did, but Tripucka, who passed away in 2013 did not survive long enough to celebrate it. Tripucka's son, Kelly Tripucka, played for the Detroit Pistons, Utah Jazz and Charlotte Hornets.
